1	<p><b>Present:</b> Cllrs Dorn, Shelford Wilkinson and Argent.</p> <p><b>Apologies:</b> None</p>	
2	<b>Minutes of previous meeting</b> (5 <sup>th</sup> October 2009) were agreed	
3	<p><b>Matters arising:</b></p> <p>#4: It was agreed that, once SID's stay on Beacon Hill had been completed, the next location would be Dippenhall Street.</p> <p>#5: It was agreed that the issue of the "no parking" signs in Croft Lane would be addressed as part of the forthcoming Conservation Area Review</p>	
3(a)	<p><b>PFI Lighting Contract</b></p> <p>Cllr Argent reported that, despite HCC insisting that the originally proposed Agreement would not be amended, they had now issued a replacement, rectifying virtually all the many errors we had identified.</p> <p>However, fundamental concerns remain: the Agreement is silent on the type and level of service to be provided (and HCC have confirmed that there is no intention of incorporating even some basic Service Provider KPI's in the Agreement) and there is no formula for limiting HCC's freedom to charge more or less what they like for energy.</p> <p>It was agreed that Cllr Argent would try to make further progress on these issues, and if possible to prepare a recommendation for the next (failing which, the next but one) full Council meeting. It was agreed that no recommendation, one way or the other, is possible at this time</p>	DA
3(b)	<p><b>Street Light – Redlands Lane</b></p> <p>It was understood that this light is currently working and doesn't appear to have been shot at recently, and is therefore not currently an issue.</p> <p>Cllr Dorn agreed to chase a possible supplier of an LED replacement lamp for use as a "reduced cost sample demonstration" unit at this location</p>	CD
3(c)	<p><b>Pavement – Croft Lane/Church Street Corner</b></p> <p>Hants CC to be asked for an update on their progress on this long-standing issue</p>	DA
3(d)	<p><b>Bottle Bank – Bowling Alley</b></p> <p>Cllr Wilkinson reported that "camouflage ivy" covers were due to</p>	

	<p>be fitted during the coming week.</p> <p>Possibly only temporarily, it seemed there were currently no major problems regarding the emptying cycles for these bins</p> <p>There were no reports – favourable or unfavourable – on the trial of an addition bottle bin at the Village Hall.</p>	
4&5	<p><b>Nomination of Transport Representative/Transport Representative Meeting 14/11/09</b></p> <p>Cllr Argent was volunteered for this role, and accepted it on the understanding that he would not necessarily attend the Winchester meeting(s) unless the agenda appeared to be particularly relevant to the Parish Council’s concerns.</p>	DA
6	<p><b>AOB</b></p> <p>Agreed to progress the possibility of LED Street Lamps in general (in case we don’t sign up to the PFI arrangement)</p> <p>Agreed to monitor and if necessary remove excessive “fly posting” on utility poles in the village – and if thought fit, ask the Clerk to report particularly flagrant abuse to the District Council.</p> <p>Agreed to attend the CPRE Meeting on 11/11/09 – if only in part.</p> <p>Cllr Dorn reported that the work on improving drainage in Pankridge Street seems to be progressing well, with a good and conscientious workforce, the only problem being youths (assumed!) fiddling with the traffic light controls.
